
Deck the Halls and Sing We Now of Christmas are combined here into one piece, called a medley.



**Silent Night** has been translated into many languages throughout the world. Sometimes called Tyrolean Folk Song, it was sung in the 19th century by traveling folk singers throughout Austria and Germany. An Austrian family of singers first performed it in New York City around 1840.





Frosty the Snowman was written by Americans Jack Rollins and Steve Nelson in 1950. It was recorded in the same year by Gene Autry and was later featured in an animated TV program. The song is very popular during the Christmas season even though the holiday is never mentioned.
