rhythm found frequently in Latin music is the alteration of 3/4 and 6/8 measures with the eighth note remaining constant. The main theme of Wind Dancer is based on this rhythm. The meter signature 3/4 6/8 indicates that the measures alternate between these two rhythms. The overall form of Wind Dancer is that of a repeated binary (**A B A B**) with the secondary idea being a more flowing, straightforward alla breve rhythm. Make sure the tempo does not drag in this section, and be sure to maintain the tempo of  $\frac{1}{2} = 68$ .
