About This Collection


The 23 pieces in this collection have proven to be favorites of elementary through late elementary students throughout the years. Chosen from the four stylistic periods of piano repertoire, the volume contains selections of varying difficulty levels so that it may be used over a two- to three-year period.

A companion volume, First Favorite Classics— Accompaniment Book One (Alfred #14712), contains specially composed second keyboard parts for the teacher, parent or a more advanced student. The pieces in each collection have a page-by-page cross reference, and measures are numbered to facilitate ease of use. The second keyboard part may be played on a second piano or electronic instrument and may be recorded or sequenced to enhance practice, learning and performance. A General MIDI disk (Alfred #17250), available separately, contains accompaniments for each piece in the collection. Accompaniments were especially created to enhance the musical performance in a stylistic manner. The accompaniments on the disk were recorded on separate tracks allowing teachers to use only those tracks needed for study, practice or performance. The right hand and left hand of each piece as well as the orchestrated accompaniments and rhythm parts were recorded on separate tracks.

An icon shows the TRACK number for each example on the General MIDI disk: (24) The first number after the icon is the TRACK number for the Type 0 MIDI file; the second number (in parentheses) is the TRACK number of the Type 1 MIDI file.




Suggested Order of Study
