Great Is Thy Faithfulness is a general anthem that may be used at any time during the church year. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Exodus 16: 19-21, Psalm 36: 5-7, Isaiah 33: 2, Lamentations 3: 22-23 and James 1: 17. One basic homiletical theme is that God's steadfast love never fails.

This anthem should be performed with great expression, some freedom of movement and fluid four-measure phrases. The opening verse (mm. 1-22) should be sung as a hushed prayer at dawn in gratitude for God's unchanging guidance and love, followed by a warm statement of the refrain. The middle verse is a heavenly setting for three-part women's voices that, in partnership with the accompaniment, paints the wondrous scene of God's great creation. Before the refrain can be repeated, the final verse begins, a simple duet between the men's and women's voices asking for God's pardon and strength to face the new day. The finale is a triumphant statement of the refrain that, in its last four measures, returns to the prayerful mood of the opening.

The text of this great gospel hymn was written by **Thomas Obediah Chishola**. Born on July 29, 1866, in Franklin, Kentucky, Chisholm was an ordained Methodist minister. While ill-health prevented him from devoting his life to the ministry, he nonetheless authored over 1,200 sacred poems and lived a long life. Many of his poems have become famous hymn texts, including *Great Is Thy Faithfulness*, He Was Wounded for Our Transgressions, Living for Jesus and O to Be Like Thee!

The Rev. William M. Runyan was a musician with the Moody Bible Institute and an editor for Hope Publishing Company until his death on July 29, 1957, exactly ninety-one years after Chisholm's birth. Runyan composed the music for *Great Is Thy Faithfulness* in 1923. This hymn achieved great popularity through its use in the Billy Graham Crusades in the early 1950's.

Mark Hayes is an award-winning concert plantst, composer and arranger of sacred choral, piano, and orchestral music. With over 400 published works to his credit, Mark has also recorded numerous solo piano albums and has received the Gospel Music Association's prestigious Dove Award, which is the equivalent to a Grammy in gospel music. A graduate of Baylor University, he has served as an adjunct professor of composition at Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Kansas City, Missouri.
