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Introducing Chords

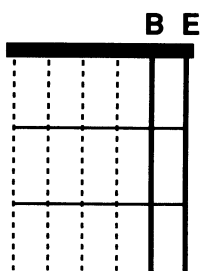
A CHORD is a combination of two or more harmonious notes. All notes except the whole note have a stem going up or down. When notes are to be struck together as a CHORD, they are connected by the same stem.

(Not to be played.)

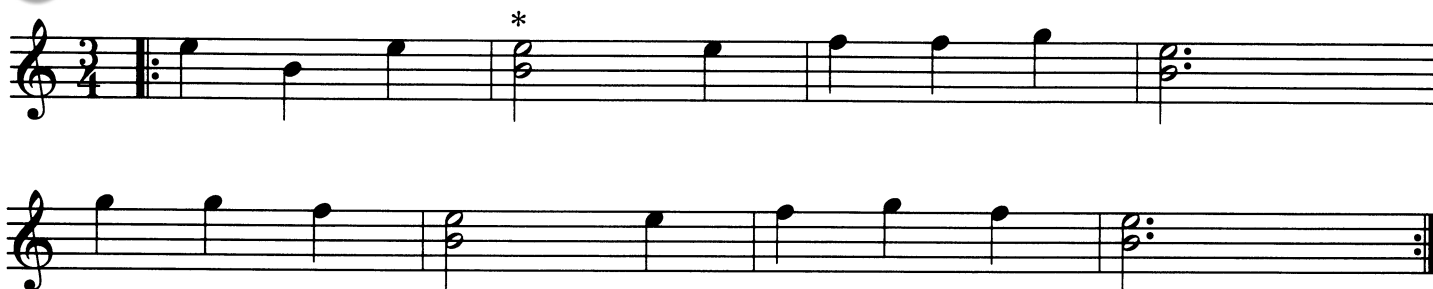


Preliminary Study

Two-note chords on the open B and E strings.

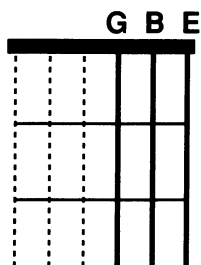
