

**Deo! (Marching to Bethlehem)** is adapted from the traditional Zulu folksong commonly known as *Siyahamba*. Reflecting the spirit of the original Zulu text (“We are marching in the light of God”), this new Christmas arrangement is especially appropriate for seasonal concert or worship processional. The opening (“Deo! Gloria in excelsis,” mm. 1-8) may be performed slowly and freely by a soloist or solo quartet standing in the back of the room. If a processional is used, the processional should begin with the new tempo at m. 9.

In the tradition of African folk music, this setting prominently features call-and-response. In performance, enhance this antiphonal interplay by dividing the sections of the choir and placing them around the room. Where phrases are repeated at a softer dynamic level (e.g., mm. 24-28), assign the softer phrases to a solo quartet or to half of the choir.

Available in three voicings for singers of all ages, **Deo! (Marching to Bethlehem)** is appropriate for both school and church choirs for holiday concerts and Christmas worship. When performed in worship, suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Psalm 9, Isaiah 9: 2-7, Luke 2: 1-20 and Titus 2: 11-14. One basic homiletical theme is journeying to the manger with the shepherds and wise men.

With music degrees from St. Norbert College in DePere, Wisconsin, the University of Wisconsin (Madison), and the University of Colorado (Boulder), he has received choral composition awards from the Twin Cities Church Musicians' Association and the Wisconsin Choral Directors' Association, and his works are widely published and performed.
