“*Gay-tah teh-weh-leh-deh*” and “*Med-hehn teh-weh-leh-deh*” are phonetic pronunciations of Amharic phrases meaning “The Lord is born” and “The Savior is born.” Amharic is spoken by millions of northern Africans and is the official language of Ethiopia.



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
