Pachelbel's Canon of Peace is an inspired new choral arrangement of one of history's most beloved instrumental works, *Canon and Gigue* or, more popularly, *Canon in D*, by Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706). The arranger has added the timeless Latin text, "*Dona nobis pacem*," or "grant us peace," aptly reflecting the very soothing nature of this work.

Do - na no - bis pa - cem.DAW-nah NAW-bees PAH-chem.

Pachelbel originally scored his canon for three violins and basso continuo. The "canon" is actually a chaconne, built upon a bass accompaniment of only eight pitches, which are repeated throughout while three violins play complex canonic material. This choral arrangement is based upon the ground bass and thematic material from the other instrumental parts. The arranger has also added tempo and dynamic indications, an optional flute part, accompaniment and text.

Available in three voicings for singers of all ages, Pachelbel's Canon of Peace is appropriate for performance by both school and church choirs. For school choirs, it is suitable for concerts, festivals and baccalaureate or graduation. It may be performed in worship throughout the year and especially for communion and Peace Sunday. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Numbers 6: 24-26, John 14: 27 and Philippians 4: 6-7. One basts homiletical theme is the peace that passes human understanding.

Johann Pachelbel was a German Baroque composer who was one of the most important predecessors of Johann Sebastian Bach. An acclaimed organist, Pachelbel was also a gifted and prolific composer. His first important position was as organist to the court of Essenach, which is Bach's birthplace.

Patrick M. Liebergen is Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin (Stout). With music degrees from St. Norbert College in DePere, Wisconsin, the University of Wisconsin (Madison) and the University of Colorado (Boulder), he frequently appears throughout the country as an adjudicator and clinician. Dr. Liebergen has received choral composition awards from the Twin Cities Church Musicians' Association and the Wisconsin Choral Directors' Association, and his works are widely published and performed.
