Behold, a virgin will conceive and bear a Son, who will be called Immanuel.

Come to Set Us Free is a lively Advent anthem filled with joyful expectation. Adapted from a traditional Puerto Rican folk hymn, it is available for both S.A.T.B. and 2-part any combination voices and features optional soloists and percussion accompaniment. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Isaiah 7: 10-17, Matthew 1: 18-25 and Luke 1: 26-38. One basic homiletical theme is preparing for the birth of Emmanuel, God with us.

In rehearsal, strive for a bright, articulate sound with energetic syncopation. Avoid the temptation to sing too loudly. To achieve a better balance in mm. 65-76, a few altos may sing with the tenors.
