Holy, Holy is an arrangement by Mark Hayes of the beloved nineteenth century hymn. With optional congregational singing on the first and fourth verses, it is appropriate for performance throughout the year, especially Ascension, Christ the King, Trinity and Pentecost. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Psalm 148, Isaiah 6: 1-3, Matthew 28: 16-20, 2 Corinthians 13: 11-13 and Revelation 4: 1-11 & 15: 1-4. One basic homiletical theme is singing praise to the Creator, the Three-in-One, Who was and is and ever shall be.
