*“Come to me, all you who are weary and heavy laden,
and I will give you rest.*

*Take my yoke upon you and learn from me,
for I am gentle and lowly in heart,
and you will find rest for your souls.”*

Is There Room for a Sinner? is a general anthem that may be especially useful for Lent and discipleship. It incorporates the refrain from a traditional 19th century American folk hymn, *Come, Ye Sinners, Poor and Needy*. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Exodus 1: 6-22 & 2: 1-10, Psalms 80 & 124, Matthew 11: 25-30, John 6: 35-40 and Romans 7: 14-25a. One basic homiletical theme is the promise of salvation through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Subtle blues harmonies lend this anthem a “soulful” quality. The flute part is entirely optional but adds special poignancy. Soloists may sing the opening section (mm. 1-14). This section may also be sung as a response to a prayer of confession. The final verse serves as a triumphant affirmation of salvation for all true believers who repent of their sins and come to Jesus in humility and servitude.
