**Wondrous Love** is a transcendent arrangement of the beloved traditional American folk hymn, *What Wondrous Love Is This!* It is especially appropriate for Lent and Holy Week. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Psalm 121, John 3: 16-17, Romans 5: 6-8 and 2 Corinthians 5: 14-15. One basic homiletical theme is the love of Christ that passes human understanding, that He should willingly suffer and die on the cross for our salvation.

Larry Shackley directs the music program at Columbia (SC) International University and holds a D.M.A. in composition from the University of South Carolina. Previously, he was staff composer for Moody Broadcasting in Chicago, and keyboardist/arranger at Willow Creek Community Church (South Barrington, IL). His choral and keyboard arrangements, broadcast themes and film scores have been heard around the world.
