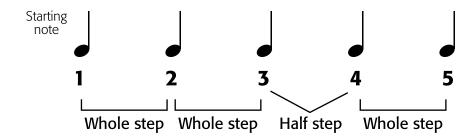
BUILDING MAJOR FIVE-FINGER PATTERNS

A major chord consists of three notes: 1, 3 and 5 of the major five-finger pattern.

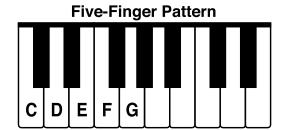


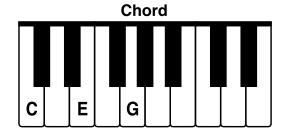

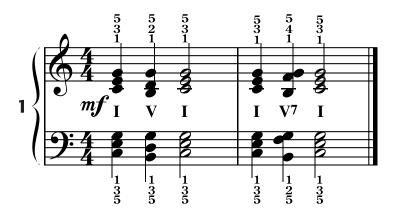


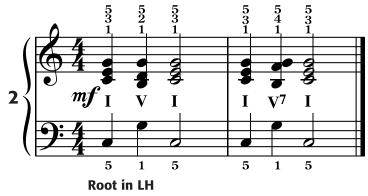
Five-Finger Pattern and Chord





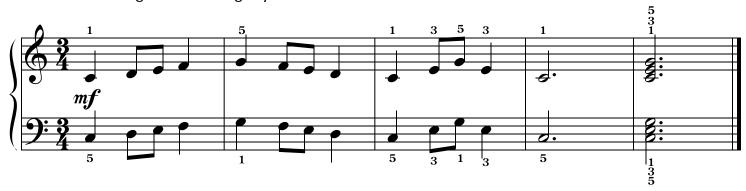

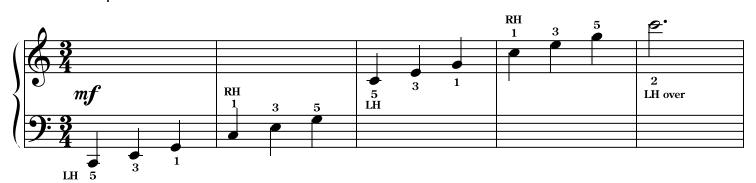
Practice Suggestions for Five-Finger Patterns and Chords (pages 3–14)

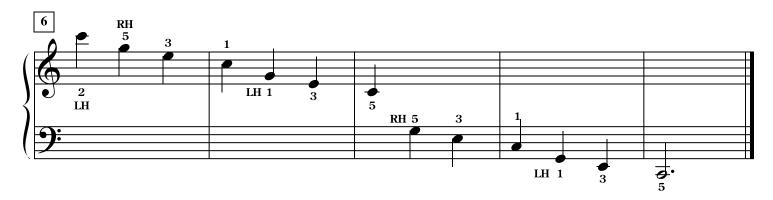
- 1. Practice legato, hands separately, then hands together.
- 2. Practice staccato, hands separately, then hands together.
- 3. Practice RH forte and LH piano, then RH piano and LH forte.
- 4. Practice RH legato and LH staccato, then RH staccato and LH legato.

Example 1: Practice hands separately, then hands together.

Example 2: Play the LH root followed by the RH chord, then play as written.
