Suitable for worship throughout the year, it may be especially appropriate for Lent and services of baptism, confirmation, family dedication, teacher ordination, and stewardship. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Isaiah 51: 1-8, Matthew 4: 12-25 and 9: 9, Mark 8: 22-38, and Luke 5: 1-11 and 27.
