## Emperor Waltz By Johann Strauss Arranged by John Cacavas

The music of Johann Strauss, Jr. is among the most recorded and performed of the semi-classical repertoire of all time. His Sunday concerts at Dommeyer's café in Vienna were the highlight of that city's social season. *Emperor Waltz* is typical of the highly melodic music of this composer. The variety of themes in this work is representative of his composition skills. The rhythm of a Strauss waltz is very important; care must be taken to ensure the "lilting" character of the piece. The opening strain should be *molto legato* which will give the music an orchestral-like texture. *Emperor Waltz* will be a crowd pleaser at any concert, as well as a delight to the performers.
