This early form of the symphony has only three movements instead of the conventional four, making this minuet the last movement. Probably for this reason, the minuet was originally written in § instead of §, implying a quicker, more rousing tempo than normal for a dance movement. Like most Haydn finales, this piece sparkles with energy and lightness that will leave an audience tapping and humming long after the music has ended.

This piece is most effectively played with one beat per measure to give the music its necessary lightness and energy. The playing style should be detached and joyful. Dynamics should be as dramatic and sudden as possible, without *crescendi* or *decrescendi*. The tempo should be constant, without *accelerandi* or *ritards*.
