**2** Tap and count aloud.

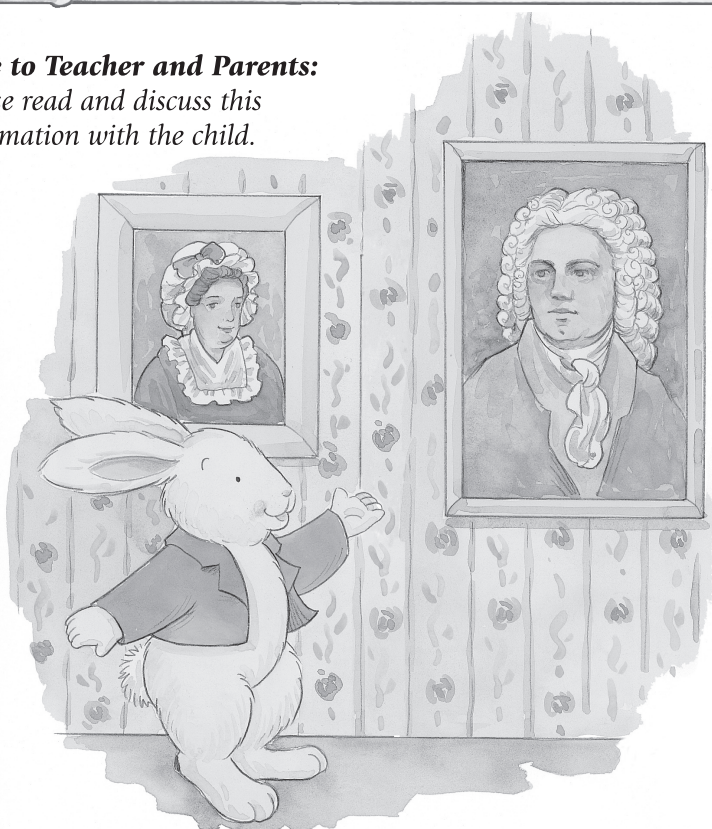
Say:	J.	S.	Bun	- ny

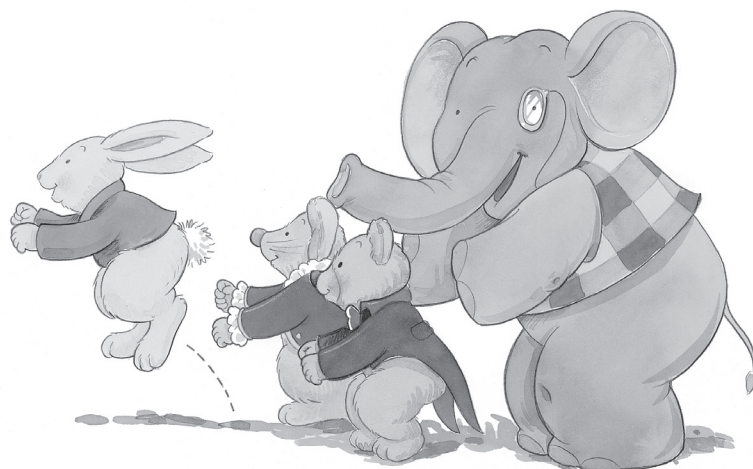


### Meet J. S. Bach

**J.** S. Bunny was named for Johann Sebastian Bach (1685–1750), a famous composer, organist and church musician from Germany. Many of his relatives were performers, composers and teachers. Bach had 20 children and taught most of them to play a musical instrument. His family spent many evenings playing and singing music together. There were enough children to make a small orchestra or choir.

### Meet J. S. Bunny

**J.** S. Bunny is a shy yellow bunny who often wears a green coat. He comes from a musical family and plays the cello. His real name is Johann Sebastian Bunny, but his parents call him J. S. Bunny for short. Few grown-ups know that he invented a famous dance called the J. S. Bunny Hop, that makes toys and children want to hop and never stop!
