PROGRAM NOTES

Maurice Ravel (1875-1937) is widely regarded as one of the most important composers of the early 20th century. His PAVANE was written in 1899 and orchestrated in 1910. It was dedicated to Princesse Edmond de Polignac, formerly Winnaretta Singer; interestingly, she was also the heiress to the fortune that her father had accomplated from his sewing machine business. PAVANE was premiered as an orchestral work in London in 1911 and remains one of Ravel's most popular works even today.

NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

All Belwin string parts have been carefully bowed and fingered appropriately by level. The Yellow Very Beginning series includes many bowings as well as reminder fingerings for first-time readers. The Red Beginning series includes frequent bowings to assist younger players. Fingerings for altered pitches are often marked. The Green Intermediate series includes appropriately placed bowings for middle-level students. Fingerings and positions are marked for notes beyond first position. The Blue Concert series includes bowings appropriate for the experienced high school player. Fingerings and position markings are indicated for difficult passages.
