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NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This Count Basie classic features piano, tenor sax, trumpet and trombone solos with some occasional fills for the drummer. A real crowd-pleaser, this chart also offers some optional encore “tags” that are cued by the conductor who asks the quintessential Basie question, “One More Time?”

In general, the sound should be light and flowing but always with an intensity that comes from vitality and energy, regardless of volume level. It is important to play this chart at a rather fast tempo to suggest a certain level of exuberance. Avoid a ponderous approach, instead striving for a buoyant, swinging quality. Pay attention to the articulation markings. The longer eighth-note lines are always played legato but with careful attention to tonguing at strategic places; at a faster tempo, the jazz eighth note actually becomes smooth and even so be careful not to inject too much of a swing feel or it will sound corny.

The guitar style in the Basie band should be similar to a strumming banjo with only a small amount of amplifier sound. The predominant sound should be from the acoustic instrument and the tone should be warm, not “twangy”. The strumming should be on each beat with accents on beats 2 and 4. If this is too difficult, play only the accented beats.

Above all, it is most important to listen to the music to ultimately grasp the innate concepts of the music: phrasing, tone, expression and rhythmic feeling.
