^{*} Walter Savage Landor, an English poet and writer of prose, was born in Warwick, England on Jan. 30, 1775. He was the son of a doctor and a wealthy mother. Landor was educated at Rugby and at Trinity College, Oxford. In 1808 he fought as a volunteer for the Spanish War of Liberation against the French. Three years later, Landor moved to Wales and married Julia Thuiller, whom he had met at a dance in the town of Bath. Landor and his wife spent time in England and France, but eventually settled with their four children in Italy. During his life, Landor was friends with such great writers as Charles Dickens, Elizabeth Barrett, and Robert Browning. Landor died in September of 1864. "The Spinning Wheel" is a setting of Landor's "Mother, I Cannot Mind My Wheel."
