




EARTH ANGEL (WILL YOU BE MINE)

"Earth Angel (Will You Be Mine)" was originally released by The Penguins as the B-side to "Hey Señorita." It quickly gained more popularity than its A-side pairing, and reached #1 on the Billboard charts in 1955. While "Earth Angel" is on Rolling Stone Magazine's list of the 500 Greatest Songs of All Time, it proved to be the only major hit from The Penguins. Because of its popularity, it has been featured in many movies, television shows, and Broadway musicals.








LOVE IS A MANY SPLENDORED THING

This classic song was featured in the 1955 movie *Love Is a Many Splendored Thing*. The movie went on to win an Academy Award for Best Song. The best-selling version of the song was recorded by The Four Aces which reached #1 on the Billboard charts in 1955. "Love Is a Many Splendored Thing" has been recorded by Frank Sinatra and Andy Williams, and in 2006 Barry Manilow included the hit on his album *The Greatest Songs of the Fifties*.

SIXTEEN CANDLES

"Sixteen Candles" is the biggest hit from the popular 1950s group The Crests. It reached #2 on the Billboard charts in 1958. In addition to "Sixteen Candles," The Crests had several Top 40 hits including "Step By Step," "Trouble in Paradise," and "The Angels Listened In." A rarity at that time, The Crests were a racially integrated group with two African-American members, one Puerto Rican, and one Italian. In 2004, they were inducted into The Vocal Group Hall of Fame.
