For worship performance, **Amid the Cold of Winter** is suitable for Advent (especially the Annunciation of Mary), Christmas, and Epiphany. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Isaiah 11:1-10 and 35:1-4, Matthew 2:1-12, and Luke 1:26-56 and 2:8-20.
