## PROGRAM NOTES

Percy Grainger discovered this traditional English dancing tune in the folk song collection of the musicologist Cecil Sharp, who had heard the violinist of the Bidford Morris Dancers play this merry tune in 1906. The word *hey* denotes a particular figure in Morris Dancing. Morris Dances are still danced by teams of Morris Men decked out with bells and quaint ornaments to the music of the fiddle or *the pipe and tabor* (a sort of drum and fife) in several agricultural districts in England. The *hey* involves the interweaving of generally two lines of dancers.

## NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

*Shepherd's Hey* should be played in a light and crisp manner. The staccato articulations should be approached as a lift or a space to the note, not clipping the note with a "dut" or a "tut." The accents should be performed with added weight to the note; however, do not allow them to be overemphasized.

Throughout this arrangement I have used the phrase, "to the fore." While it is an obvious nod to Percy Grainger, it should be noted that those lines should be brought out within the ensemble. At measure 33, please note the use of the triangle and bells for color. Feel free to adjust dynamics for these effects to speak though the ensemble. I have also noted at measures 41, 49 and 57 an increase in tempo. Feel free to adjust the tempo to suit your ensemble.
