

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
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
The Ionian Mode



Tisket, A Tasket (in Ionian mode)









A Composition in Dorian Mode

Compose and write a melody for the right hand with the left-hand accompaniment pattern below. Use only notes from the DORIAN SCALE. Use any note values you wish, but a note that is played at the same time as a bass note must be written directly above it. Experiment at the keyboard, then write your melody on the treble staffs below. Add your own dynamics.

Suggestions: Modal melodies usually sound best when most of the notes move stepwise with only occasional skips. Be sure to include at least one C and one B in your melody.
