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Reviewing the Sharp Sign

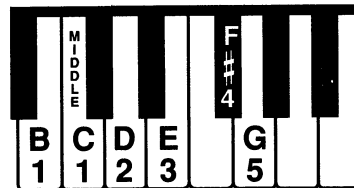


The SHARP SIGN before a note means play the next key to the right, whether BLACK or WHITE. When a sharp sign appears before a note, it applies to that note for the rest of the measure!

Circle the notes that are SHARP:



RH C POSITION for *PLAY A POLKA*



1 plays B or C

PLAY A POLKA

This popular traditional polka is very easy, and is fun to play.

Auto: ON "Single Finger"

Rhythm: Moderately slow POLKA or MARCH*

Register: PIANO, TRUMPET, CLARINET, or ACCORDION

Sustain: OFF. Add DUET, if available.

C POSITION

To end this piece, press the STOP button on the last quarter rest.

*NOTE TO TEACHERS: On some instruments, POLKA & MARCH Rhythms are "double-time" rhythms. When this is the case, substitute any Rhythm that comes closest to a straight "1 - 2 - 3 - 4" beat. This is also true of the SWING Rhythm in pieces later in this book.
