PROGRAM NOTES

One of the most well-known works of the 19th century was *Ma Vlast* (My Fatherland) by Czech composer Bedrich Smetana. Composed between 1874 and 1879, it contains six symphonic poems. "The Moldau," the second of the six poems, is undoubtedly the most popular. Following the course of the Vltava River through the countryside, the music reflects the woods and meadows, a country peasant wedding, a round dance of mermaids, and proud castles and palaces before majestically vanishing in the distance. Expertly crafted, this arrangement is of the dance-like *Country Wedding*.

NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

All Belwin string parts have been carefully bowed and fingered appropriately by level. The Yellow Very Beginning series includes many bowings as well as reminder fingerings for first-time readers. The Red Beginning series includes frequent bowings to assist younger players. Fingerings for altered pitches are often marked. The Green Intermediate series includes appropriately placed bowings for middle-level students. Fingerings and positions are marked for notes beyond first position. The Blue Concert series includes bowings appropriate for the experienced high school player. Fingerings and position markings are indicated for difficult passages.
