## The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee

#### The Show

Centering on a fictional spelling bee somewhere in Putnam County, USA, this show follows the inner and outer travails of six eccentric young adolescents as they fiercely compete against each other—with valuable and (and often not-so-valuable) help from parents and other grown-ups around them. The bee's hostess, Rona Lisa Peretti, is a former spelling champion, and the proceedings include a "comfort counselor" for losers, audience volunteers for early rounds of spelling, and a boy contestant who spells out the letters to words with his "magic foot" before speaking them aloud. The musical is based on "C-R-E-P-U-S-C-L-E," a play by Rebecca Feldman.

#### The Song

When the spelling bee is down to its four surviving contestants, Catholic schoolgirl Marcy Park seems a strong contender for first place. Rona tells the audience that Marcy speaks five languages—only to be corrected by Marcy, who, tired of being touted as "the perfect student," sings "I Speak Six Languages" in protest. In the song, she manages to simultaneously bemoan and show off her skills.

# **Anything Goes** (1987 Revival Version)

#### The Show

Like the hit screwball musical comedy of 1935 on which it is based, this revival of Anything Goes takes place on a trans-Atlantic pleasure cruise from New York to England. Young Billy Crocker boards the ship to deliver a passport to his traveling boss, Wall Street banker Elisha Whitney; before the ship departs, Billy learns that his long lost love Hope Harcourt is a also passenger, and soon will be married to English Lord Evelyn Oakleigh. Billy stays on board for the cruise, befriends gangster Moonface Martin and his moll, and is himself mistaken for Public Enemy #1. Meanwhile, evangelist-turned-nightclub-singer Reno Sweeney—at first romantically interested in Billy—falls in love with Lord Evelyn. After many twists and turns, outlandish disguises and further mistaken identities, all find wedded bliss in the arms of the right partner.
