NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

Be sure to observe the many different marked accents. Also please note the grace notes in the students' parts. Omitting these grace notes would significantly diminish this polka style; however, these grace notes are marked in parentheses. You can use use your discretion whether you wish the students to play them. The pianist should always play them. The form of this music is ABA. The A theme is very playful with dance downbeat/upbeats, while the B section should be a little slower in a warm, legato, expressive style.
