### **PROGRAM NOTES**

Pietro Antonio Locatelli was a child prodigy on the violin who was at one time a student of Arcangelo Corelli. He was successful both as a travelling concert virtuoso and later as a composer and publisher of fine music. Locatelli's music has stayed consistently popular with string players for over two centuries.

#### **NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR**

This transcription comes from the final movement of *Concerto Grosso Opus 1, #5*. The main challenge is to play this fast! It calls for a light touch and, of course, lots of slow practice before it can be played at concert speed. The violinists should notice that, although it's a fast and exciting piece of music, it is based on the simple building blocks of scales and arpeggios. Perhaps goals can be set based on reaching a certain metronome speed by a particular date. There are lots of teaching possibilities with this one. Have fun!

#### **NOTE FROM THE EDITOR**

All Belwin string parts have been carefully bowed and fingered appropriately by level. The Yellow Very Beginning series includes many bowings as well as reminder fingerings for first-time readers. The Red Beginning series includes frequent bowings to assist younger players. Fingerings for altered pitches are often marked. The Green Intermediate series includes appropriately placed bowings for middle-level students. Fingerings and positions are marked for notes beyond first position. The Blue Concert series includes bowings appropriate for the experienced high school player. Fingerings and position markings are indicated for difficult passages.
