Notes to the Conductor

Good, solid Mozart! Perfect for any festival or contest and it's really fun to tell the orchestra that he wrote this in 1764 when he was only 8 years old. The symphony was written while the family was on tour in London and first performed on February 21, 1765. The work shows the influence of other composers such as his father, Leopold, and Johann Christian Bach, an important symphonic composer working in London at the time. It was originally scored for two oboes, two horns, and strings. The first movement is in sonata form with the two themes in the exposition in the tonic and dominant. The development is minimal and the recapitulation revisits both themes from the exposition in the tonic.
