Jubilate Music is pleased to offer this unique adaptation of three choruses from George Frederic Handel's *Messiah* for the Advent and Christmas season. The overriding strength of this medley is that Hal Hopson has masterfully kept the integrity of Handel's original manuscript while making it accessible for S.A.B. voices.

PERFORMANCE OPTIONS

This medley, lasting approximately 11 minutes, may be sung in the context of a worship service or concert.

Selected choruses may be sung as anthems throughout the Christmas season.

The keyboard accompaniment may be played on either piano or organ. The organ registrations are provided by the editor; however, organists are encouraged to use their own creativity in choosing the most effective stops. There is also a conductor's score and parts available for flute, oboe, string quartet (with optional bass) and keyboard.

The narration parts are optional as well as the keyboard accompaniment to the narrations. The narration parts may be read by one reader. Alterations may be made to the some of the original King James language in the narrations as desired.
