* PERFECT DAY * 4

We each have a different idea of what our Perfect Day would be and so this Lou Reed song will mean something different to each of us. There have been so many versions of this song, about an idyllic day when everything goes right for you and you and your partner have a peaceful and harmonious time away from the pressures of life. It is also about being responsible, "you will reap what you sow". Relationships are of all different types and all are about this responsibility.

* HALLELUJAH * 10

Hallelujah is quite an abstract inclusion in this collection of seasonal songs. It's loosely based on the biblical story of Samson and Delilah. The lure of good over evil. The bittersweetness of revenge. The rebirth of relationships. The power of God over man. This is an unusual one for Christmas, quite a macabre song in some respects, dark. It's totally different to what you would expect a Christmas song to be but it's very powerful, very poignant.

* DO YOU HEAR WHAT I HEAR? * 44

Do You Hear What I Hear? is my duet with my Susan Search winner, Amber. We had such fun. This song, about the nativity is a song that involves children, families, everyone, so it was relevant that I sang this with someone. It's very much a feel good song, once again evoking that magic of Christmas.

* DON'T DREAM IT'S OVER * 14

Not all the songs on this album are Christmas songs. I wanted there to be a mix that would flow with all our moods during this season. As much as the season is a time for reflection, it is also a time for fun and enjoyment. My version of the Crowded House song Don't Dream It's Over is there to put people in a party mood! It's a real feel good song, a happy tune. It's a very pretty song.

* THE FIRST NOEL * 28

The wonderful thing about this season is that it takes us across a range of our emotions and asks us to think deeply as adults but also to cast our minds back to the simple joyfulness of childhood when the magic of Christmas was most meaningful. The First Noel was chosen for the album because it is a Christmas story. Every kid likes to hear a Christmas story and this traditional song tells the story of the Shepherd's journey and the pursuit of a star. It really does bring the magic of Christmas to my mind.

* O HOLY NIGHT * 20

O Holy Night recalls a most special night when The King of Kings was born, the real meaning of Christmas. This song captures the essence of what Christmas is all about, capturing the more spiritual aspect of Christmas, celebrating the birth of Christ.

* AWAY IN A MANGER * 33

Away In A Manger is about innocence and the fact that God was made man that Christmas Eve. He was born humble with no riches, in a lowly stable. It's a lovely sentiment, humility, something we can all be reminded of. Hearing a particular song can take you back to such graphic memories of the past. I couldn't sing this in the studio without being reminded of The Nativity plays we used to do at school. I was in a couple of nativity plays and there were quite a few fights between the shepherds and the three wise men! So Away In A Manger is a way of recalling those days. It is also about the magic of Christmas for me.

* MAKE ME A CHANNEL OF YOUR PEACE * 36

Make Me a Channel Of Your Peace is a well known hymn, very traditional, very beautiful. It's about not being involved in the violence of today, not being involved in political argument and trying to make peace between God and man. My feelings on this can be summed up so simply. Lord use me as your instrument. Let me continue to make people happy. You meant me to do this.

* AULD LANG SYNE * 24

Auld Lang Syne is very traditional. It originates from the Burns poem and is exactly what it says – the renewing of resolutions, the passing of the old year to the new. It's such an emotive song, sung by so many people across the world. No matter what your faith or culture, we all have a time of the year when we ask ourselves to make resolutions, and ask whether we have kept those we made before.

* O COME ALL YE FAITHFUL * 41

The real magic of Christmas and indeed the whole holiday season is people coming together and this is evoked wonderfully with O Come All Ye Faithful. On one hand is the coming together of everyone to celebrate the birth of Jesus and on the other it is about the coming together of voices to celebrate Christmas. For me it conjures up choirs and carol concerts. You hear O Come All Ye Faithful in the shops, you hear it when choirs practice for carol concerts. So you know Christmas is coming when you hear it for the very first time in the year. Very joyful.
