
Tuning Your Ukulele


Introducing B-flat

A *flat* | lowers a note a *half* step (the distance from one fret to another is called a half step). By is played one fret lower than the note B. When a flat note appears in a measure, it is still flat until









Ties

A *tie* is a curved line that connects two of the same note. When two notes are tied, don't play the second note, but keep the first note playing until the second note is done. You are really adding the two notes together.
