SAMPLE LETTER TO PARENTS

Dear Parents:

All of us in the music department at (school name) are happy that you and your child have decided to join us in the wonderful world of music making. The first weeks of learning anything new can sometimes be frustrating. With your help, I know that our program will afford your child a successful music experience.

Small amounts of concentrated practice are better than longer periods of unfocused practice time. If you can provide a quiet place at the same time everyday where your child will be uninterrupted, he/she will develop correct practice habits that will last a lifetime. Good ventilation, a straight chair, a music stand and adequate light will all help to insure success. The book we have selected for your child's beginning experience with music contains many familiar folk songs that you will easily recognize. You do not have to have a background in music to know if your child is playing correctly. Your interest and praise are very important factors in guaranteeing your child's enjoyment of music, and success in playing his/her instrument.


If you have a keyboard instrument in your home, a book of simple to play yet full sounding piano accompaniments to the music in your child's book is available. These accompaniments will help the beginning student play rhythms correctly and will motivate them because of their fullness of sound. The piano accompaniments are also available on an audio CD.

I will periodically keep you informed of your child's progress and want you to know that you can call on me at any time with questions regarding the beginning band program.

I look forward to seeing you at our first concert which will take place in a few months.

Page I of the student book is shown here.



Page 2 of all student books presents a complete fingering chart and diagram of the instrument. The top of page 3 contains a photograph of each instrument with its parts clearly labeled. On the bottom of page 3 there is a daily practice chart for students to fill out.

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Pages 4 and 5 of this score provide a detailed chart of what is taught in Book One of the *Yamaha Band Student*. You can clearly see where each new note, rhythm, term etc. is introduced.

Page 6 begins the actual music found in the method. The upper left corner of each page references the student book page numbers. All new material taught in the student books is clearly boxed at the top of each score page. Throughout the score there are additional boxes that present teaching suggestions, motivational hints, and public relations ideas.

The piano accompaniments included in the score are also available in a separate book as well as on an audio CD.

The last three pages of this score contain rhythm charts that can be used throughout the method. You may wish to write them out on a blackboard for class use. They are also available in poster size.

The score pages clearly show what each instrument plays with the following exceptions: Eb Horn and Eb Alto Clarinet are not included. Eb Horn is the same as F Horn—up a step. Eb Alto Clarinet is generally an octave lower than Alto Saxophone. Keyboard percussion is most often an octave lower than Flute and it also includes some rolls.







In this score, the material that is common to all instruments appears in the top box. All new notes taught are shown with their fingerings in the second box. The third box presents all new material unique to the percussion book.
