### **PROGRAM NOTES**

The most recognizable melody at holiday time is presented in this arrangement for very young performers and older listeners. It has it all and James Pierpont, the original composer, would be proud!

## NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

The tempo is marked *Moderately*, J = 96-120, making this arrangement useable by all elementary concert bands from beginning to more advanced. Choose the tempo that best suits the ability level of your ensemble.

If you want a shorter version, and for very beginning ensembles, perform the first 16 measures only (the Chorus) stopping at the Fine. This shorter version is useable for very young performers.

There are some terms and accidentals that may be new musical information for some young performers and should be explained before the first reading. (D.C. al Fine, fingerings for accidentals, courtesy accidentals, etc.).

The Percussion 2 part (Suspended Cymbal and Sleigh Bells) is an optional part which will give the expected "authentic sound" to the arrangement. For advanced performers on these instruments, and if they have learned eighth notes, change the rhythm to two eighth notes per each quarter note.

Have fun with this piece. I'm sure that the band will enjoy performing it.
