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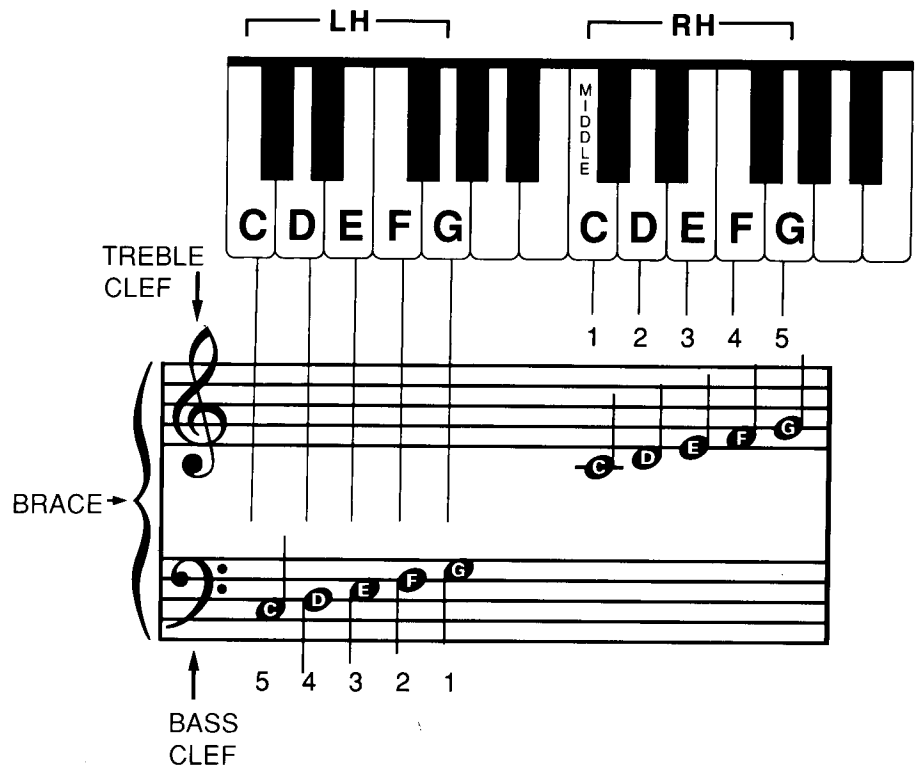
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The Grand Staff

The **BASS STAFF & TREBLE STAFF**, when joined together with a **BRACE**, make up the **GRAND STAFF**.



TIME SIGNATURE


Music has numbers at the beginning called the **TIME SIGNATURE**.

$\frac{4}{4}$ means 4 beats to each measure
 $\frac{4}{4}$ means a **QUARTER NOTE** gets one beat.

PLAYING ON THE GRAND STAFF Track 7

Only the starting finger number for each hand is given.

Play slowly, at first, about $\text{♩} = 50$, or slower.
 Gradually increase tempo to $\text{♩} = 92$. Play with recording.

This sign  is a **WHOLE REST**.
 LH is silent a whole measure!

RH silent a whole measure.
