Notes to the Conductor

The unicorn is a legendary animal commonly portrayed as a white horse with a goat's beard and a large, pointed, spiraling horn projecting from its forehead. First mentioned by the ancient Greeks, it became the most important imaginary animal of the Middle Ages and Renaissance when it was commonly described as a wild woodland creature. A symbol of purity and grace, its horn was said to have the power to render poisoned water potable and to heal sickness. Until the 19th century, belief in unicorns was widespread.

In Greek mythology, the Minotaur was a creature with the head of a bull on the body of a man. He dwelt at the center of the Cretan Labyrinth, an elaborate mazelike construction built for King Minos of Crete and designed by the architect Daedalus and his son Icarus, who were ordered to build it to hold the Minotaur.

This piece seeks to musically depict the quiet and serene character of the unicorn and contrast that theme with one that embodies the hideous and terrifying legend of the Minotaur.
