RING THE EASTER BELLS

for S.A.B. or 2-part mixed voices, accompanied, with optional handbells*



Ring the Easter Bells is a joyous resurrection anthem in a flexible arrangement for S.A.B. or 2-part mixed voices. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Psalm 118: 14–24, Luke 24: 1–12, Acts 10: 34–43 and 1 Corinthians 15: 19–26. One basic homiletical theme is the invitation for all true believers to share in the triumph of God's love in Christ's resurrection.

Rehearse the melody with all voices singing energetically but lightly in unison on a neutral syllable such as "doo." Strive for a brightly focused and articulate sound. Keep the voices evenly matched in the canon that begins in m. 55, adding the keyboard right hand as an equally articulate descant to the singers.

He holds piano performance degrees from Furman University and the University of Texas.
