Noel Peace Canon will be a delightful addition to your Christmas repertoire. Seamlessly weaving the beloved "Dona Nobis Pacem" (with a fresh seasonal text) with "The First Noel," the two meld together beautifully. The Canon is introduced first, then is quoted throughout the Carol until the song builds dramatically to the statement "Born is the King who will bring us peace," and then concludes with another statement of the Canon.

In rehearsal, pay careful attention to the dynamic indications so that the song builds to its apex and then eases down to the thoughtful ending. Observe the rests so that diction, phrasing, and ending consonants are consistent and unified. If you are singing the Canon melody, or an implication of it, bring that out, but be careful not to overwhelm the Carol melody. At the end, close to the "m" of "pacem" and continue to soften down so that the piano "solo" of the last four measures and the last chord can be heard even though the piano softens to pp.
