**Peace Will Come** offers a unique and heartfelt perspective on the coming of Christmas to all. Pay close attention to all dynamic markings so as to color and shape the expressive melody and text all the more. Take extra care in the rubato sections and don't hesitate in taking your time in those spots to allow the text to resonate with the listeners. Tune the unison passages gently and carefully so as to heighten the lush SATB passages.

**Terry W. York** is Professor of Christian Ministry and Church Music at Baylor University's George W. Truett Theological Seminary. He joined the faculty in 1998 after serving three years as the Associate Pastor of Park Cities Baptist Church in Dallas, Texas. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from California Baptist University, and his Master of Church Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary.

He was the Project Coordinator for *The Baptist Hymnal* in 1991. In all, Dr. York has published more than 40 hymns, including the well-known "Worthy of Worship," and more than 60 choral anthem texts.

**David Danner** (1951–1993) was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, with bachelors and masters degrees in music from Central State University and George Peabody College (Vanderbilt University). As an editor, composer, arranger, and orchestrator, David had over 200 published compositions, which were heard by millions in his relatively brief lifetime. His major works included *And We Beheld His Glory* and *Joy Comes in the Morning*.

**David Schwoebel** is Minister of Music / Composer in Residence at Derbyshire Baptist Church in Richmond, Virginia. He is a graduate of McKendree College in Lebanon, IL and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas, where he received a Bachelor of Arts in Voice and Organ Performance, and a Master of Church Music with an emphasis in Composition.

As an ordained minister, David administrates and oversees a comprehensive music ministry of six choral organizations, four handbell choirs, and a 32-piece orchestra. His energetic hands-on approach to ministry finds him working each week with people of all ages, encouraging and equipping them to discover and develop their varied musical talents and skills.

As a sacred composer, many of David's hymn tunes have been included in three hymnals: 1991 "Baptist Hymnal," "Celebrating Grace Hymnal" and "Glory to God: The Presbyterian Hymnal."
