Declare His Glory is a modern choral favorite among many. In this new setting from Benjamin Harlan, the exciting elements of Peterson's original are retained while creating a stunning new setting, giving the piece a fresh touch. Primarily based on Psalm 96:3, the piece begins forcefully and dramatically. By closely observing articulation and dynamics, you will add to the overall drama of the piece. Be sensitive to shaping the phrases and the contrasting legato sections, therefore heightening the text. The piece is perfect for missions emphases or ccasions all year long. Related scriptures include Mark 16:15 and Matthew 28:19

John W. Peterson (1921–2006) began his musical career while he was still in his teens. During World War II, he served as an Army Air Force pilot. Later, he attended Moody Bible Institute and served on the radio staff there for a number of years. He graduated from the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago and shortly thereafter settled in Pennsylvania to continue his songwriting career. He then moved to Grand Rapids, Michigan, where for over ten years he was President and Editor-in-Chief of Singspiration, a sacred music publishing company. Later he moved to Scottsdale, Arizona, where he continued his writing and co-founded Good Life Productions.

John W. Peterson's music is loved and sung around the world. Mr. Peterson composed well over 1000 songs, including "It Took a Miracle," "Over the Sunset Mountains," "So Send I You," "Heaven Came Down," and "Surely Goodness and Mercy." In addition, he wrote over 35 cantatas and musicals. Among them are "Night of Miracles," "No Greater Love," and "Down from His Glory." Over 10 million copies of these cantatas and musicals have been published and sold.

Benjamin Harlan and his wife, Connie, divide their time between New Orleans and St. Francisville, Louisiana. In addition to composing and arranging, Benjamin remains active in local church music ministry and particularly enjoys helping congregations strengthen or rediscover the richness of congregational song.
