PROGRAM NOTES

Maurice Ravel (1875–1937) is widely regarded as one of the most important composers of the early 20th century. His *Pavane* was written for piano in 1899 and orchestrated in 1910. It was dedicated to Princess Edmond de Polignac, formerly Winnaretta Singer; interestingly, she was also the heiress to the fortune that her father had accumulated from his sewing machine business. The orchestral version of the *Pavane* was premiered in London in 1911 and remains to this day one of Ravel's most popular works.

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This arrangement of Maurice Ravel's timeless classic *Pavane Pour Une Infante Défunte* (Pavane for a Dead Princess) offers your very young ensemble a wonderful opportunity to perform in an expressive, lyrical style. Before rehearsing the piece for the first time, you may want to introduce the <code>J_JJJ</code> and <code>J_JJJ</code> rhythms to your band, incorporating them in your warm-ups and scales.
