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Think snow! Here's a great winter concert tune when you are looking for something new! The melody comes from a Hungarian folk song. All sections play the melody!

NOTES TO THE CONDUCTOR

This melody comes from the Hungarian folk song known as "The Handsome Butcher." The optional bell and percussion parts can add a wonderful timbre to the ensemble and help aide students in subdividing the pulse. However, these instruments are not necessary for performance. If employed, the percussion parts should not overshadow the ensemble. There are three statements of the theme and everyone gets a chance to play the A theme, B theme, or both. The second statement of the melody begins at measure 30 with the 2nd violins and violas playing the melody in augmentation (longer note values). In this passage, the melody should be played with long, full bow strokes so it has a sustained quality. The third and final melodic statement begins at measure 56, where the melody is presented in a round. Throughout the piece, a proper balance between melody and accompaniment should be maintained. I hope you and your students enjoy studying and performing *Sleigh Song*.

NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

All Belwin string parts have been carefully bowed and fingered appropriately by level. The Yellow Very Beginning series includes many bowings as well as reminder fingerings for first-time readers. The Red Beginning series includes frequent bowings to assist younger players. Fingerings for altered pitches are often marked. The Green Intermediate series includes appropriately placed bowings for middle-level students. Fingerings and positions are marked for notes beyond first position. The Blue Concert series includes bowings appropriate for the experienced high school player. Fingerings and position markings are indicated for difficult passages.
