Performance Notes

Directors, please conduct this one freely—feel the ebb and flow of the emotion, especially in the Schubert tune. The tempos are suggested starting points; please find and use the tempo that works best for your group and situation. Pay attention to the dynamic flow of the piece, and make a good contrast between dynamic sections. Keep the LV sections clean, and take good care of the bass clef melody, especially if it is played with handbells instead of handchimes. May it be a true worshipful experience for your ringers and your congregation.



Bill Ingram has been writing and arranging for handbells since 1975 and has about 750 published handbell compositions and arrangements in print with numerous publishers.
