For many years, I've enjoyed the great energy in this southern gospel favorite. Pairing it with just a hint of "Mary Had a Baby" offers a unique treatment in this arrangement. The vocal parts are fairly easy to learn and the driving accompaniment will offer a fun, supportive background. A rhythm track has been provided for those desiring a true southern sound, but this is written in such a way as to be equally strong if performed with the piano-only option. Perhaps the most difficult to master will be the text of the verse in this quick tempo. It may help to rehearse speaking the words slowly in each verse before learning the notes. The instruments drop out in several places, leaving the vocals unassisted. These are neat effects but will require work on unison singing and securing the proper pitches along the way. Enjoy singing the style of this piece in a more relaxed vocal fashion and letting the music drive the message.

Mary McDonald is a multi-talented musician from Knoxville, Tennessee. In addition to her vork as a composer, arranger, pianist, and organist, she was a sacred choral editor for a major educational publisher for more than twenty years (and continues in the role as editorial consultant). Mary has served as both organist and pianist for a local Baptist church. Her music and talents have blessed choirs and congregations across the country for more than thirty years. Mary is a well-known composer of more than 800 choral anthems, many seasonal cantatas, and keyboard collections. She is published by every major publisher of church music and has had numerous top-selling anthems. Her unique blend of heart, hands, and humor, combined with a wide range of writing and performing styles, keep her in constant demand as a keyboard artist and keyboard and choral elinician. One of Mary's greatest joys has been serving as accompanist for the Tennessee Men's Choral since 1965. Mary also served as the first woman President of the Southern Baptist Church Music Conference. She was recent recipient of second place in the John Ness Beck Foundation composition award and is a member of the American Guild of Organists (AGO) and the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP). Mary is a 1978 graduate of Carson-Newman College. She and her husband, Brian, a Knoxville architect, have been married for 36 years and have two married children and three grandchildren.
