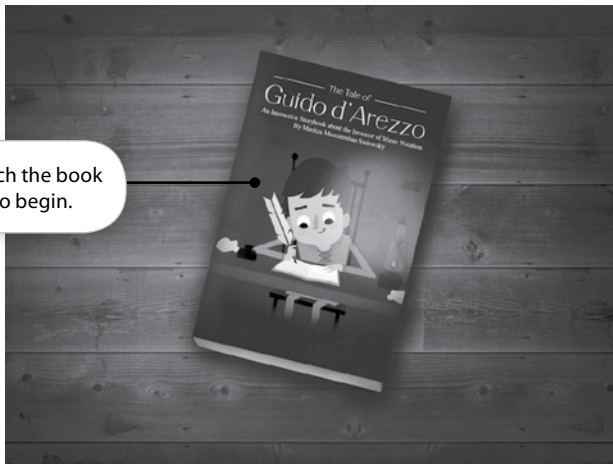


# How to Use This Product

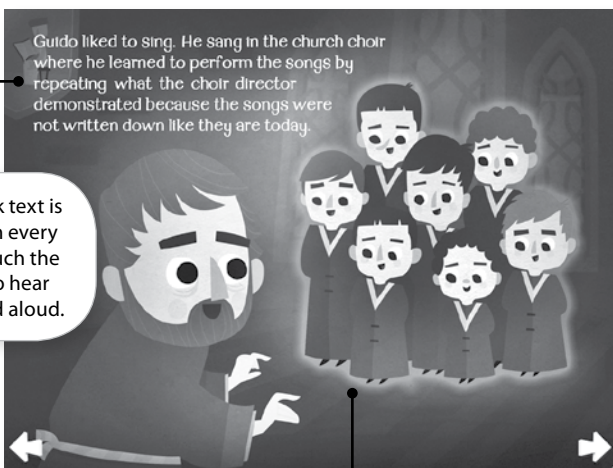
## Title Screen
