Call to Me should be performed in a commanding, energetic tone. Don't be afraid to be expressive with the words "call" and "come." The text is from two major prophets of the Old Testament, through whom God was speaking to all of us for all time, so a very resonant tone is appropriate. There is a long crescendo at the end, so be sure to start softly enough, and be very gradual until measure 56, where the whole note should "bloom" into the fortissimo at the end. Be sure not to shorten the final quarter note, but stretch it into beat three of the last measure with a crisp cutoff.

Carl Nygard is a lifelong resident of Pennsylvania, and is a member of ASCAP. He has more than 200 anthems in print with various American publishers and has conducted festival and community choirs in 14 states. His music has been performed on six continents, and he still accepts commissions from churches, schools, and community choirs.
