Shepherds, Tell the News - Set in the style of a spiritual, this lively anthem for the Christmas season tells the story found in Luke 2:17 of the shepherds telling everyone the news about the angels' visit, and the Child that was born in Bethlehem. It incorporates a syncopated version of the familiar spiritual, "Go, Tell It on the Mountain" and pairs it with the newly written melody in a most joyful way. This piece, from the cantata, *A Night for Rejoicing*, can be performed with piano only, or with chamber orchestra, and is a delight for choir and congregation alike. Other scriptures that can be used with this anthem include: Isaiah 40:9-11, Matthew 1:18-23 and Luke 1:5-19.

Lee Dengler is a composer and arranger with nearly 400 published choral anthems, books for vocal and piano solo, and Christmas and Holy Week cantatas to his credit. He studied choral composition and arranging with Alice Parker and received his Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees from West Chester University in West Chester, PA. He taught voice and composition at Goshen College for many years. He is a freelance music editor and engraver.

Susan Naus Dengler is a lyricist and writer, as well as a children's choir conductor, soprano soloist and voice teacher. She received degrees in Music Education from West Chester University and Church Music and Vocal Performance from Valparaiso University. Lee and Susan are Ministers of Music at College Mennonite Church in Goshen, Indiana.
