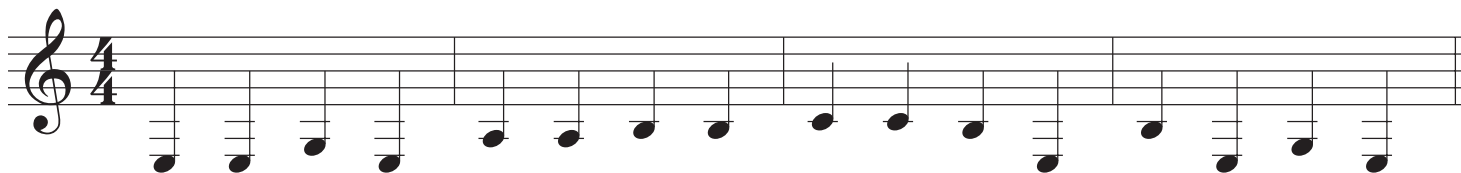
 LEDGER LINES

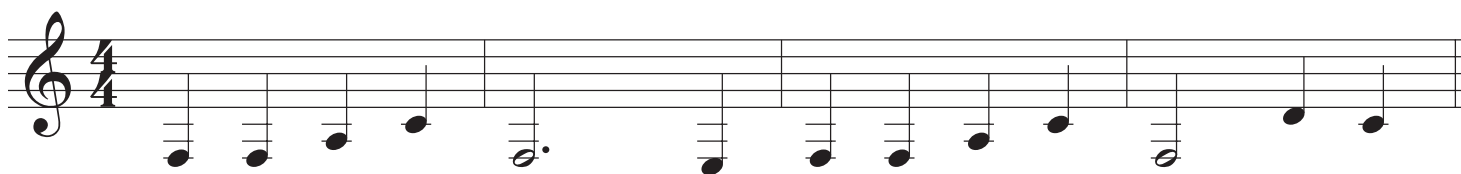

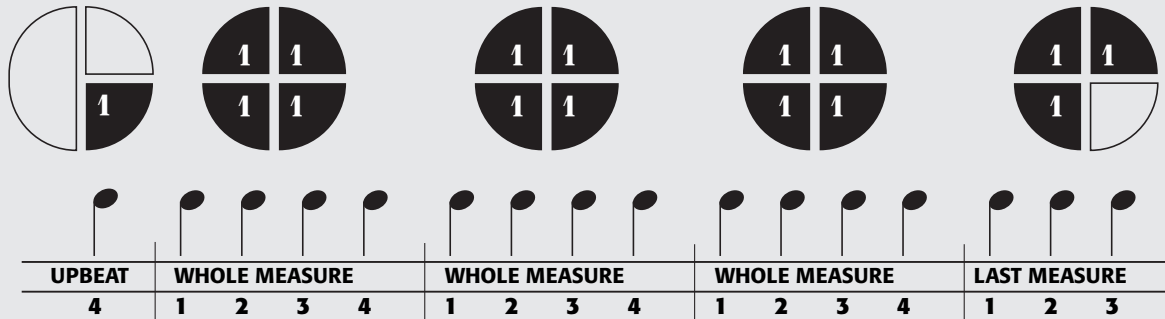

Incomplete Measures, or Pickup

Not every piece of music begins on beat 1. Sometimes, music begins with an incomplete measure called an *upbeat*, or *pickup*. If the pickup has just one beat, the last measure will have only three beats in $\frac{4}{4}$ or two beats in $\frac{3}{4}$.



HOUSE OF THE RISING SUN Track 92

Eric Burdon and The Animals turned this traditional song into a rock hit in the 1960s. All the notes are from the A Minor Pentatonic scale.
