

Here I Am, Lord – I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!" These words from Isaiah 6:8 (NIV) are the cornerstone verse for the beloved setting originally penned by Daniel Schutte in 1981. Its powerful message challenges us, even now, to heed the call of the Lord and follow Him wherever He leads. Paired with an older but familiar hymn of invitation, "Have Thine Own Way, Lord," this arrangement blends seamlessly to form a fresh call to God's people. These well-known tunes make for a singer-friendly choral anthem that offers supportive accompaniment features and a welcomed modulation to the final chorus. It is ideal for anthems of general use or a service with a mission emphasis.

Mary McDonald is a well-known composer of more than 800 choral anthems and many cantatas and keyboard collections. Her unique blend of heart, hands, and humor, combined with a wide range of writing and performing styles, has kept her in constant demand for the past 35 years as a composer, keyboard artist, and choral clinician.
